Prophecies about Messiah

Introduction and Definitions

1. In this study, we list many of the more prominent prophecies about the Messiah (Hebrew = "Moshiach", Greek = "Christos" or Christ in English, all meaning "Anointed / Chosen Savior / Deliverer) from the Hebrew Tanakh, know in modern, common English as the "Old Testament". So that we have a common starting point, we will first define some Hebrew terms, since it was the language used to codify the majority of the prophecies under review. All other languages are translation attempts. The actual word "TaNaKh" in Hebrew is an acronym consisting of the First Letter of each of the Names of the 3 major divisions of the Masoretic Texts that comprise it (Torah, Nevi'im, Ketuvim). The Tanakh is more commonly known in English as the "Old Testament"- a term which indicates to many that it is "aged out" or "put away, or merely "historical" in nature — a view which I do not hold, since God says His Word is forever. While on this topic of proper definitions, I prefer to identify these texts, in English, as "Original Covenant" (instead of "old testament") or use it's true Hebrew name, "TaNaKh", which consists of 3 parts:

1. Torah

As a further definition, I will refer to what is commonly called the "new testament" as the "Revealed Covenant", since that term more accurately describes Jesus (Yeshua) and His mission detailed in those very writings, and their proper relationship to the Tanakh, which is the foundation of the prophecies concerning Messiah.

In each of the sections that follow, I correlate the Prophecy (from Tanakh) to it's fulfillment or it's "proof-point" in the Revealed Covenant. Any clarifying comments appear in the text within curly-braces - " {...}". It is my intent to let the Scriptural References speak for themselves.

Prophetic details about Messiah (Yeshua / Jesus):2

1. Messiah will be a direct descendant of Eve:

- i. Gen 3:15 NASU And I will put enmity Between you and the woman, And between your seed and her seed; He shall bruise you on the head, And you shall bruise him on the heel."
 - { Note that via Mary's Linage, this DID happen (according to Luke's lineage)³}

ii. Revealed Covenant Fulfillment:

 Gal 4:4-5 – NASU – 4 "But when the fullness of the time came, God sent forth His Son, born of a woman, born under the Law, 5 so that He might redeem those who were under the Law, that we might receive the adoption as sons."

2. Messiah will be a direct descendant of Abraham:

- i. <u>Gen. 12:3</u> NASU <u>"And I will bless those who bless you, And the one who curses you I will curse. And in you all the families of the earth will be blessed."</u>
- ii. Gen 18:18 NASU "The Lord said, "Shall I hide from Abraham what I am about to do, 18 since Abraham will surely become a great and mighty nation, and in him all the nations of the earth will be blessed?"

iii. Revealed Covenant Fulfillment:

Acts 3:25-26 – NASU - 25 "It is you { those who believe in Messiah} who are the sons of the prophets and of the covenant which God made with your fathers, saying to Abraham, 'AND IN YOUR SEED ALL THE FAMILIES OF THE EARTH SHALL BE BLESSED.' 26 "For you first, God raised up His Servant { that is, Messiah } and sent Him to bless you by turning every one of you from your wicked ways."

3. Messiah will be a direct descendant of Judah:

ii. Gen 49:10 – NASU - The scepter shall not depart from Judah, Nor the ruler's staff from between his feet, Until Shiloh comes, And to him shall be the obedience of the peoples."

iii. Revealed Covenant Fulfillment:

 { The genealogies of both Matthew and of Luke clearly Identify Judah, the fourth son of Jacob (later renamed by the Angel of God to "Israel"), as the ancestor of Jesus on both His adoptive-father's side and His mothers side (via the lineage detailed in Luke) }.

4. Messiah will be a descendant of David:

- i. Ps 132:11-12 NASU 11 "The Lord has sworn to David A truth from which He will not turn back: " Of the fruit of your body I will set upon your throne. 12 "If your sons will keep My covenant And My testimony which I will teach them, Their sons also shall sit upon your throne forever."
- ii. Jer 23:5-6 NASU 5 "Behold, the days are coming," declares the Lord,
- iii. "When I will raise up for David a righteous Branch; And He will reign as king and act wisely And do justice and righteousness in the land. 6 "In His days Judah will be saved, And Israel will dwell securely; And this is His name by which He will be called, 'The Lord our righteousness.'"
- iv. Jer 33:14-18 NASU 14 'Behold, days are coming,' declares the Lord, 'when I will fulfill the good word which I have spoken concerning the house of Israel and the house of Judah. 15 'In those days and at that time I will cause a

righteous Branch of David to spring forth; and He shall execute justice and righteousness on the earth. 16 'In those days Judah will be saved and Jerusalem will dwell in safety; and this is the name by which she will be called: theLord is our righteousness.' 17 "For thus says the Lord, 'David shall never lack a man to sit on the throne of the house of Israel; 18 and the Levitical priests shall never lack a man before Me to offer burnt offerings, to burn grain offerings and to prepare sacrifices continually.'"

v. Revealed Covenant Fulfillment:

 Luke 1:32-34 – NASU - 32 "He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High; and the Lord God will give Him the throne of His father David; 33 and He will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and His kingdom will have no end."

5. Messiah will be born of a virgin:

i. <u>Isa 7:13-14 – NASU - 13 "Then he said, "Listen now, O house of David! Is it too slight a thing for you to try the patience of men, that you will try the patience of my God as well? 14 "Therefore the Lord Himself will give you a sign: Behold, a virgin will be with child and bear a son, and she will call His name Immanuel."</u>

ii. Revealed Covenant Fulfillment:

- 1. Matt 1:18-25 NASU 18 "Now the birth of Jesus Christ was as follows: when His mother Mary had been betrothed to Joseph, before they came together she was found to be with child by the Holy Spirit. 19 And Joseph her husband, being a righteous man and not wanting to disgrace her, planned to send her away secretly. 20 But when he had considered this, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, saying, "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife; for the Child who has been conceived in her is of the Holy Spirit. 21 "She will bear a Son; and you shall call His name Jesus, for He will save His people from their sins." 22 Now all this took place to fulfill what was spoken by the Lord through the prophet: 23 "BEHOLD, THE VIRGIN SHALL BE WITH CHILD AND SHALL BEAR A SON, AND THEY SHALL CALL HIS NAME IMMANUEL," which translated means, "GOD WITH US." 24 And Joseph awoke from his sleep and did as the angel of the Lord commanded him, and took Mary as his wife, 25 but kept her a virgin until she gave birth to a Son; and he called His name Jesus."
- 2. Luke 1:26-35 NASU 26 "Now in the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent from God to a city in Galilee called Nazareth, 27 to a virgin engaged to a man whose name was Joseph, of the descendants of David; and the virgin's name was Mary. 28 And coming in, he said to her, "Greetings, favored one! The Lord is with you." 29 But she was very perplexed at this statement, and kept pondering what kind of salutation this was. 30 The angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary;

for you have found favor with God. 31 "And behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall name Him Jesus. 32 "He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High; and the Lord God will give Him the throne of His father David; 33 and He will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and His kingdom will have no end." 34 Mary said to the angel, "How can this be, since I am a virgin?" 35 The angel answered and said to her, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; and for that reason the holy Child shall be called the Son of God."

6. Messiah will be born in Bethlehem:

 Mic 5:2 – NASU - "But as for you, Bethlehem Ephrathah, Too little to be among the clans of Judah, From you One will go forth for Me to be ruler in Israel. His goings forth are from long ago, From the days of eternity."

ii. Revealed Covenant Fulfillment:

- Matt 2:1-2 NASU Now after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea in the days of Herod the king, magi from the east arrived in Jerusalem, saying, 2 "Where is He who has been born King of the Jews? For we saw His star in the east and have come to worship Him."
- 2. Luke 2:4-7 NASU 4 Joseph also went up from Galilee, from the city of Nazareth, to Judea, to the city of David which is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and family of David, 5 in order to register along with Mary, who was engaged to him, and was with child. 6 While they were there, the days were completed for her to give birth. 7 And she gave birth to her firstborn son; and she wrapped Him in cloths, and laid Him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn."

7. Messiah will be a Prophet, like Moses:

i. Deut 18:15-20 – NASU - 15 " The Lord your God will raise up for you a prophet like me from among you, from your countrymen, you shall listen to him. 16 "This is according to all that you asked of the Lord your God in Horeb on the day of the assembly, saying, 'Let me not hear again the voice of the Lord my God, let me not see this great fire anymore, or I will die.' 17 " The Lord said to me, 'They have spoken well. 18 'I will raise up a prophet from among their countrymen like you, and I will put My words in his mouth, and he shall speak to them all that I command him. 19 ' It shall come about that whoever will not listen to My words which he shall speak in My name, I Myself will require it of him."

ii. Revealed Covenant Fulfillment:

 Acts 3:22-23 – NASU - 22 "Moses said, 'THE LORD GOD WILL RAISE UP FOR YOU A PROPHET LIKE ME FROM YOUR BRETHREN; TO HIM YOU SHALL GIVE HEED to everything He says to you. 23 ' And it will be that every soul that does not heed that prophet shall be utterly destroyed from among the people."

8. Messiah will be the Son of God:

- i. <u>Ps 2:7 NASU "I will surely tell of the decree of the Lord: He said to Me, 'You</u> are My Son, Today I have begotten You."
- ii. Revealed Covenant Fulfillment:
 - Matt 3:17- NASU And behold, a voice out of the heavens said, "This
 is My beloved Son, in whom I am well-pleased."
 - Mark 1:11 NASU and a voice came out of the heavens: "You are My beloved Son, in You I am well-pleased."
 - Luke 3:22 NASU and the Holy Spirit descended upon Him in bodily form like a dove, and a voice came out of heaven, "You are My beloved Son, in You I am well-pleased."

9. Kings will honor and pay homage to Messiah:

 Ps 72:10-11 – NASU - 10 "Let the kings of Tarshish and of the islands bring presents; The kings of Sheba and Seba offer gifts. 11 And let all kings bow down before him, All nations serve him."

ii. Revealed Covenant Fulfillment:

- 1. Matt 2:1-11 NASU 2 "Now after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea in the days of Herod the king, magi from the east arrived in Jerusalem, saying, 2 "Where is He who has been born King of the Jews? For we saw His star in the east and have come to worship Him."
 3 When Herod the king heard this, he was troubled, and all Jerusalem with him. 4 Gathering together all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Messiah was to be born. 5 They said to him, "In Bethlehem of Judea; for this is what has been written by the prophet: 6 'AND YOU, BETHLEHEM, LAND OF JUDAH, ARE BY NO MEANS LEAST AMONG THE LEADERS OF JUDAH; FOR OUT OF YOU SHALL COME FORTH A RULER
- 2. WHO WILL SHEPHERD MY PEOPLE ISRAEL." 7 Then Herod secretly called the magi and determined from them the exact time the star appeared. 8 And he sent them to Bethlehem and said, "Go and search carefully for the Child; and when you have found Him, report to me, so that I too may come and worship Him." 9 After hearing the king, they went their way; and the star, which they had seen in the east, went on before them until it came and stood over the place where the Child was. 10 When they saw the star, they rejoiced exceedingly with great joy. 11 After coming into the house they saw the Child with Mary His mother; and they fell to the ground and worshiped Him. Then, opening their treasures, they presented to Him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh."

10. Messiah's first ministerial work will be in Galilee:

i. Isa 9:1-7 - NASU - "But there will be no more gloom for her who was in anguish; in earlier times He treated the land of Zebulun and the land of Naphtali with contempt, but later on He shall make it glorious, by the way of the sea, on the other side of Jordan, Galilee of the Gentiles. 2 The people who walk in darkness Will see a great light; Those who live in a dark land, The light will shine on them. 3 You shall multiply the nation, You shall increase their gladness; They will be glad in Your presence As with the gladness of harvest, As men rejoice when they divide the spoil. 4 For You shall break the yoke of their burden and the staff on their shoulders, The rod of their oppressor, as at the battle of Midian. 5 For every boot of the booted warrior in the battle tumult, And cloak rolled in blood, will be for burning, fuel for the fire. 6 For a child will be born to us, a son will be given to us; And the government will rest on His shoulders; And His name will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Eternal Father, Prince of Peace. 7 There will be no end to the increase of His government or of peace, On the throne of David and over his kingdom, To establish it and to uphold it with justice and righteousness From then on and forevermore. The zeal of the Lord of hosts will accomplish this."

ii. Revealed Covenant Fulfillment:

1. Matt 4:12-17 – NASU - 12 "Now when Jesus heard that John had been taken into custody, He withdrew into Galilee; 13 and leaving Nazareth, He came and settled in Capernaum, which is by the sea, in the region of Zebulun and Naphtali. 14 This was to fulfill what was spoken through Isaiah the prophet: 15 "THE LAND OF ZEBULUN AND THE LAND OF NAPHTALI, BY THE WAY OF THE SEA, BEYOND THE JORDAN, GALILEE OF THE GENTILES — 16 "THE PEOPLE WHO WERE SITTING IN DARKNESS SAW A GREAT LIGHT, AND THOSE WHO WERE SITTING IN THE LAND AND SHADOW OF DEATH, UPON THEM A LIGHT DAWNED."
17 From that time Jesus began to preach and say, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand."

11. Messiah will perform healing miracles:

i. <u>Isa 35:5-6 – NASU - "Then the eyes of the blind will be opened And the ears of the deaf will be unstopped. 6 Then the lame will leap like a deer, And the tongue of the mute will shout for joy. For waters will break forth in the wilderness And streams in the Arabah."</u>

ii. Revealed Covenant Fulfillment:

 Matt 4:24-25 – NASU - 24 "The news about Him spread throughout all Syria; and they brought to Him all who were ill, those suffering with various diseases and pains, demoniacs, epileptics, paralytics; and He healed them."

- 2. Matt 8:16-17 NASU 16 "When evening came, they brought to Him many who were demon-possessed; and He cast out the spirits with a word, and healed all who were ill."
- 3. Matt 8:28-33 NASU 28 "When He came to the other side into the country of the Gadarenes, two men who were demon-possessed met Him as they were coming out of the tombs. They were so extremely violent that no one could pass by that way. 29 And they cried out, saying, "What business do we have with each other, Son of God? Have You come here to torment us before the time?" 30 Now there was a herd of many swine feeding at a distance from them. 31 The demons began to entreat Him, saying, "If You are going to cast us out, send us into the herd of swine." 32 And He said to them, "Go!" And they came out and went into the swine, and the whole herd rushed down the steep bank into the sea and perished in the waters."
- 4. Matt 9:27-30 NASU 27 "As Jesus went on from there, two blind men followed Him, crying out, "Have mercy on us, Son of David!" 28 When He entered the house, the blind men came up to Him, and Jesus said to them, "Do you believe that I am able to do this?" They said to Him, "Yes, Lord." 29 Then He touched their eyes, saying, " It shall be done to you according to your faith." 30 And their eyes were opened."
- Matt 9:32-34 NASU 32 "As they were going out, a mute, demonpossessed man was brought to Him. 33 After the demon was cast out, the mute man spoke; and the crowds were amazed, and were saying," Nothing like this has ever been seen in Israel."
- 6. Matt 11:4-6 NASU 4 "Jesus answered and said to them, "Go and report to John what you hear and see: 5 the BLIND RECEIVE SIGHT and the lame walk, the lepers are cleansed and the deaf hear, the dead are raised up, and the POOR HAVE THE GOSPEL PREACHED TO THEM. 6 "And blessed is he who does not take offense at Me."
- Matt 12:22-23 NASU 22 "Then a demon-possessed man who was blind and mute was brought to Jesus, and He healed him, so that the mute man spoke and saw."
- 8. ***** Matt 15:22-28 NASU 22 "And a Canaanite woman from that region came out and began to cry out, saying, "Have mercy on me, Lord, Son of David; my daughter is cruellydemon-possessed." 23 But He did not answer her a word. And His disciples came and implored Him, saying, "Send her away, because she keeps shouting at us." 24 But He answered and said, "I was sent only to the lost sheep of the house of Israel." 25 But she came andbegan to bow down before Him, saying, "Lord, help me!" 26 And He answered and said, "It is not good to take the children's bread and throw it to the dogs." 27 But

- she said, "Yes, Lord; but even the dogs feed on the crumbs which fall from their masters' table." 28 Then Jesus said to her, "O woman, your faith is great; it shall be done for you as you wish." And her daughter was healed at once." *****
- Matt 15:30-31 NASU 30 "And large crowds came to Him, bringing with them those who were lame, crippled, blind, mute, and many others, and they laid them down at His feet; and He healed them."
- 10. Matt 17:14-18 NASU 14 "When they came to the crowd, a man came up to Jesus, falling on his knees before Him and saying, 15 " Lord, have mercy on my son, for he is a lunatic and is very ill; for he often falls into the fire and often into the water. 16 "I brought him to Your disciples, and they could not cure him." 17 And Jesus answered and said, "You unbelieving and perverted generation, how long shall I be with you? How long shall I put up with you? Bring him here to Me." 18 And Jesus rebuked him, and the demon came out of him, and the boy was cured at once."
- 11. Matt 20:30-34 NASU 30 "And two blind men sitting by the road, hearing that Jesus was passing by, cried out, "Lord, have mercy on us, Son of David!" 31 The crowd sternly told them to be quiet, but they cried out all the more, "Lord, Son of David, have mercy on us!" 32 And Jesus stopped and called them, and said, "What do you want Me to do for you?" 33 They said to Him, "Lord, we want our eyes to be opened." 34 Moved with compassion, Jesus touched their eyes; and immediately they regained their sight and followed Him."
- 12. Matt 21:14-15 NASU 14 "And the blind and the lame came to Him in the temple, and He healed them."
- 13. Mark 1:32-34 NASU 32 "When evening came, after the sun had set, they began bringing to Him all who were ill and those who weredemon-possessed. 33 And the whole city had gathered at the door. 34 And He healed many who were ill with various diseases, and cast out many demons; and He was not permitting the demons to speak, because they knew who He was. "
- 14. Mark 5:1-13 NASU "They came to the other side of the sea, into the country of the Gerasenes. 2 When He got out of the boat, immediately a man from the tombs with an unclean spirit met Him, 3 and he had his dwelling among the tombs. And no one was able to bind him anymore, even with a chain; 4 because he had often been bound with shackles and chains, and the chains had been torn apart by him and the shackles broken in pieces, and no one was strong enough to subdue him. 5 Constantly, night and day, he was screaming among the tombs and in the mountains, and gashing himself with stones. 6 Seeing Jesus from a distance, he ran up and bowed down before Him; 7 and

- shouting with a loud voice, he said, "What business do we have with each other, Jesus, Son of the Most High God? I implore You by God, do not torment me!" 8 For He had been saying to him, "Come out of the man, you unclean spirit!" 9 And He was asking him, "What is your name?" And he said to Him, "My name is Legion; for we are many." 10 And he began to implore Him earnestly not to send them out of the country. 11 Now there was a large herd of swine feeding nearby on the mountain. 12 The demons implored Him, saying, "Send us into the swine so that we may enter them." 13 Jesus gave them permission. And coming out, the unclean spirits entered the swine; and the herd rushed down the steep bank into the sea, about two thousand of them; and they were drowned in the sea."
- 15. Mark 7:26-30 NASU 26 "Now the woman was a Gentile, of the Syrophoenician race. And she kept asking Him to cast the demon out of her daughter. 27 And He was saying to her, "Let the children be satisfied first, for it is not good to take the children's bread and throw it to the dogs." 28 But she answered and said to Him, "Yes, Lord, but even the dogs under the table feed on the children's crumbs." 29 And He said to her, "Because of this answer go; the demon has gone out of your daughter." 30 And going back to her home, she found the child lying on the bed, the demon having left."
- 16. Mark 7:32-37 NASU 32 "They brought to Him one who was deaf and spoke with difficulty, and they implored Him to lay His hand on him. 33 Jesus took him aside from the crowd, by himself, and put His fingers into his ears, and after spitting, He touched his tongue with the saliva; 34 and looking up to heaven with a deep sigh, He said to him, "Ephphatha!" that is, "Be opened!" 35 And his ears were opened, and the impediment of his tongue was removed, and he began speaking plainly. 36 And He gave them orders not to tell anyone; but the more He ordered them, the more widely they continued to proclaim it. 37 They were utterly astonished, saying, "He has done all things well; He makes even the deaf to hear and the mute to speak."
- 17. Mark 8:22-26 NASU 22 "And they came to Bethsaida. And they brought a blind man to Jesus and implored Him to touch him. 23

 Taking the blind man by the hand, He brought him out of the village; and after spitting on his eyes and laying His hands on him, He asked him, "Do you see anything?" 24 And he looked up and said, "I see men, for I see them like trees, walking around." 25 Then again He laid His hands on his eyes; and he looked intently and was restored, and began to see everything clearly."
- Mark 9:24-28 NASU 24 "Immediately the boy's father cried out and said, "I do believe; help my unbelief." 25 When Jesus saw that a crowd

- was rapidly gathering, He rebuked the unclean spirit, saying to it, "You deaf and mute spirit, I command you, come out of him and do not enter him again." 26 After crying out and throwing him into terrible convulsions, it came out; and the boy became so much like a corpse that most of them said, "He is dead!" 27 But Jesus took him by the hand and raised him; and he got up. "
- 19. Mark 10:46-52 NASU 46 "Then they came to Jericho. And as He was leaving Jericho with His disciples and a large crowd, a blind beggar named Bartimaeus, the son of Timaeus, was sitting by the road. 47 When he heard that it was Jesus the Nazarene, he began to cry out and say, "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!" 48 Many were sternly telling him to be quiet, but he kept crying out all the more, "

 Son of David, have mercy on me!" 49 And Jesus stopped and said, "Call him here." So they called the blind man, saying to him, " Take courage, stand up! He is calling for you." 50 Throwing aside his cloak, he jumped up and came to Jesus. 51 And answering him, Jesus said, "What do you want Me to do for you?" And the blind man said to Him, " Rabboni, I want to regain my sight!" 52 And Jesus said to him, "Go; your faith has made you well." Immediately he regained his sight and began following Him on the road."
- 20. Mark 16:9 NASU 9 ["Now after He had risen early on the first day of the week, He first appeared to Mary Magdalene, from whom He had cast out seven demons."
- 21. Luke 4:33-36 NASU 33 "In the synagogue there was a man possessed by the spirit of an unclean demon, and he cried out with a loud voice, 34 "Let us alone! What business do we have with each other, Jesus of Nazareth? Have You come to destroy us? I know who You are the Holy One of God!" 35 But Jesus rebuked him, saying, "Be quiet and come out of him!" And when the demon had thrown him down in the midst of the people, he came out of him without doing him any harm."
- 22. <u>Luke 4:41 NASU 41 "Demons also were coming out of many, shouting, "You are the Son of God!" But rebuking them, He would not allow them to speak, because they knew Him to be the Christ."</u>
- 23. Luke 7:20-23 NASU 20 "When the men came to Him, they said, "John the Baptist has sent us to You, to ask, 'Are You the Expected One, or do we look for someone else?'" 21 At that very time He cured many people of diseases and afflictions and evil spirits; and He gave sight to many who were blind. 22 And He answered and said to them, "Go and report to John what you have seen and heard: the BLIND RECEIVE SIGHT, the lame walk, the lepers are cleansed, and the deaf

- hear, the dead are raised up, the POOR HAVE THE GOSPEL PREACHED TO THEM. 23 "Blessed is he who does not take offense at Me."
- 24. <u>Luke 8:2-3 NASU "Mary who was called Magdalene, from whom seven demons had gone out, 3 and Joanna the wife of Chuza, Herod's steward, and Susanna, and many others who were contributing to their support out of their private means."</u>
- 25. Luke 8:26-33 NASU 26 "Then they sailed to the country of the Gerasenes, which is opposite Galilee. 27 And when He came out onto the land, He was met by a man from the city who was possessed with demons; and who had not put on any clothing for a long time, and was not living in a house, but in the tombs. 28 Seeing Jesus, he cried out and fell before Him, and said in a loud voice, "What business do we have with each other, Jesus, Son of the Most High God? I beg You, do not torment me." 29 For He had commanded the unclean spirit to come out of the man. For it had seized him many times; and he was bound with chains and shackles and kept under guard, and yet he would break his bonds and be driven by the demon into the desert. 30 And Jesus asked him, "What is your name?" And he said, "Legion"; for many demons had entered him. 31 They were imploring Him not to command them to go away into the abyss. 32 Now there was a herd of many swine feeding there on the mountain; and the demons implored Him to permit them to enter the swine. And He gave them permission. 33 And the demons came out of the man and entered the swine; and the herd rushed down the steep bank into the lake and was drowned."
- 26. <u>Luke 9:42 NASU 42 "While he was still approaching, the demonslammed him to the ground and threw him into a convulsion. But Jesus rebuked the unclean spirit, and healed the boy and gave him back to his father."</u>
- 27. <u>Luke 11:14-15 NASU 14</u> "And He was casting out a demon, and it was mute; when the demon had gone out, the mute man spoke; and the crowds were amazed."
- 28. Luke 13:31-33 NASU 31 "Just at that time some Pharisees
 approached, saying to Him, "Go away, leave here, for Herod wants to
 kill You." 32 And He said to them, "Go and tell that fox, 'Behold, I cast
 out demons and perform cures today and tomorrow, and the third day
 I reach My goal."
- 29. <u>Luke 18:35-43 NASU 35 "As Jesus was approaching Jericho, a blind man was sitting by the road begging. 36 Now hearing a crowd going by, he began to inquire what this was. 37 They told him that Jesus of Nazareth was passing by. 38 And he called out, saying, "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!" 39 Those who led the way were sternly</u>

- telling him to be quiet; but he kept crying out all the more, "Son of David, have mercy on me!" 40 And Jesus stopped and commanded that he be brought to Him; and when he came near, He questioned him, 41 "What do you want Me to do for you?" And he said, "Lord, I want to regain my sight!" 42 And Jesus said to him, "Receive your sight; your faith has made you well." 43 Immediately he regained his sight and began following Him, glorifying God; and when all the people saw it, they gave praise to God."
- 30. John 5:5-9 NASU 5 "A man was there who had been ill for thirtyeight years. 6 When Jesus saw him lying there, and knew that he had
 already been a long time in that condition, He said to him, "Do you
 wish to get well?" 7 The sick man answered Him, "Sir, I have no man
 to put me into the pool when the water is stirred up, but while I am
 coming, another steps down before me." 8 Jesus said to him, " Get up,
 pick up your pallet and walk." 9 Immediately the man became well,
 and picked up his pallet and began to walk."
- 31. John 9:1-7 NASU "As He passed by, He saw a man blind from birth.

 2 And His disciples asked Him, " Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he would be born blind?" 3 Jesus answered, "It was neither that this man sinned, nor his parents; but it was so that the works of God might be displayed in him. 4 "We must work the works of Him who sent Me as long as it is day; night is coming when no one can work. 5 "While I am in the world, I am the Light of the world." 6

 When He had said this, He spat on the ground, and made clay of the spittle, and applied the clay to his eyes, 7 and said to him, "Go, wash in the pool of Siloam" (which is translated, Sent). So he went away and washed, and came back seeing."

12. Messiah will be the chief cornerstone:

- i. Ps 118:22-23 NASU 22 "The stone which the builders rejected Has become the chief corner stone. 23 This is the Lord's doing; It is marvelous in our eyes."
- ii. <u>Isa 28:16 NASU 16 "Therefore thus says the Lord God," Behold, I am laying in Zion a stone, a tested stone, A costly cornerstone for the foundation, firmly placed.</u> He who believes in it will not be disturbed."

iii. Revealed Covenant Fulfillment:

 Matt 21:42-44 – NASU - 42 "Jesus said to them, "Did you never read in the Scriptures, 'THE STONE WHICH THE BUILDERS REJECTED, THIS BECAME THE CHIEF CORNER stone; THIS CAME ABOUT FROM THE LORD, AND IT IS MARVELOUS IN OUR EYES'? 43 "Therefore I say to you, the kingdom of God will be taken away from you and given to a people, producing the fruit of it. 44 "And he who falls on this stone will be broken to pieces; but on whomever it falls, it will scatter him like dust."

- 2. Acts 4:11-12 NASU 11 " He is the STONE WHICH WAS REJECTED by you, THE BUILDERS, but WHICH BECAME THE CHIEF CORNER stone."
- 3. ***** Eph 2:19-22 NASU 19 "So then you are no longer strangers and aliens, but you are fellow citizens with the saints, and are of God's household, 20 having been built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Christ Jesus Himself being the corner stone, 21 in whom the whole building, being fitted together, is growing into a holy temple in the Lord, 22 in whom you also are being built together into a dwelling of God in the Spirit." *****
- 4. 1 Peter 2:4-8 NASU 4 "And coming to Him as to a living stone which has been rejected by men, but is choice and precious in the sight of God, 5 you also, as living stones, are being built up as a spiritual house for a holy priesthood, to offer up spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. 6 For this is contained in Scripture: "BEHOLD, I LAY IN ZION A CHOICE STONE, A PRECIOUS CORNER stone, AND HE WHO BELIEVES IN HIM WILL NOT BE DISAPPOINTED." 7 This precious value, then, is for you who believe; but for those who disbelieve, "THE STONE WHICH THE BUILDERS REJECTED, THIS BECAME THE VERY CORNER stone," 8 and, " A STONE OF STUMBLING AND A ROCK OF OFFENSE"; for they stumble because they are disobedient to the word, and to this doom they were also appointed."

13. Messiah has 2 missions:

- i. <u>Isa 61:1-2 = Mission # 1 NASU "The Spirit of the Lord God is upon me, Because the Lord has anointed me To bring good news to the afflicted; He has sent me to bind up the brokenhearted, To proclaim liberty to captives And freedom to prisoners; 2 To proclaim the favorable year of the Lord ..."</u>
- ii. Isa 61:2B-3 = Mission #2 NASU And the day of vengeance of our God; To comfort all who mourn, 3 To grant those who mourn in Zion, Giving them a garland instead of ashes, The oil of gladness instead of mourning, The mantle of praise instead of a spirit of fainting. So they will be called oaks of righteousness, The planting of the Lord, that He may be glorified."

iii. Revealed Covenant Fulfillment:

1. FIRST MISSION:: Luke 4:16-22 – NASU - 16 "And He came to Nazareth, where He had been brought up; and as was His custom, He entered the synagogue on the Sabbath, and stood up to read. 17 And the book of the prophet Isaiah was handed to Him. And He opened the book and found the place where it was written, 18 "THE SPIRIT OF THE LORD IS UPON ME, BECAUSE HE ANOINTED ME TO PREACH THE GOSPEL TO THE POOR. HE HAS SENT ME TO PROCLAIM RELEASE TO THE CAPTIVES, AND RECOVERY OF SIGHT TO THE BLIND, TO SET FREE THOSE WHO ARE OPPRESSED, 19 TO PROCLAIM THE FAVORABLE YEAR OF THE LORD." 20 And He closed the book, gave it back to the

- attendant and sat down; and the eyes of all in the synagogue were fixed on Him. 21 And He began to say to them, "Today this Scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing."
- 2. <u>SECOND MISSION (From Isa 61:2B-3) Will occur at the end of the Age</u> (the World, as we currently know it).
- 14. Many People will hear the Good News of Salvation (Gospel) but will not believe in Messiah (the "arm of the LORD" and "Savior/Deliverer"):
 - i. Isa 53:1-6 NASU "Who has believed our message? And to whom has the arm of the Lord been revealed? 2 For He grew up before Him like a tender shoot, And like a root out of parched ground; He has no stately form or majesty That we should look upon Him, Nor appearance that we should be attracted to Him. 3 He was despised and forsaken of men, A man of sorrows and acquainted with grief; And like one from whom men hide their face He was despised, and we did not esteem Him. 4 Surely our griefs He Himself bore, And our sorrows He carried; Yet we ourselves esteemed Him stricken, Smitten of God, and afflicted. 5 But He was pierced through for our transgressions, He was crushed for our iniquities; The chastening for our well-being fell upon Him, And by His scourging we are healed. 6 All of us like sheep have gone astray ,Each of us has turned to his own way; But the Lord has caused the iniquity of us all To fall on Him."

ii. Revealed Covenant Fulfillment:

1. John 12:37-43 – NASU - 37 "But though He had performed so many signs before them, yet they were not believing in Him. 38 This was to fulfill the word of Isaiah the prophet which he spoke: "LORD, WHO HAS BELIEVED OUR REPORT? AND TO WHOM HAS THE ARM OF THE LORD BEEN REVEALED?" 39 For this reason they could not believe, for Isaiah said again, 40 "HE HAS BLINDED THEIR EYES AND HE HARDENED THEIR HEART, SO THAT THEY WOULD NOT SEE WITH THEIR EYES AND PERCEIVE WITH THEIR HEART, AND BE CONVERTED AND I HEAL THEM." 41 These things Isaiah said because he saw His glory, and he spoke of Him. 42 Nevertheless many even of the rulers believed in Him, but because of the Pharisees they were not confessing Him, for fear that they would be put out of the synagogue; 43 for they loved the approval of men rather than the approval of God."

15. Messiah will be widely rejected:

i. <u>Isa 53:3 - NASU - 3 He was despised and forsaken of men, A man of sorrows and acquainted with grief; And like one from whom men hide their face He was despised, and we did not esteem Him.</u>

ii. Revealed Covenant Fulfillment:

Matt 27:20-26 – NASU - 20 "But the chief priests and the elders
persuaded the crowds to ask for Barabbas and to put Jesus to death.
 But the governor said to them, "Which of the two do you want me

- to release for you?" And they said, "Barabbas." 22 Pilate said to them, "Then what shall I do with Jesus who is called Christ?" They all said, "Crucify Him!" 23 And he said, "Why, what evil has He done?" But they kept shouting all the more, saying, "Crucify Him!" 24 When Pilate saw that he was accomplishing nothing, but rather that a riot was starting, he took water and washed his hands in front of the crowd, saying, "I am innocent of this Man's blood; see to that yourselves." 25 And all the people said, "His blood shall be on us and on our children!"
- 2. Mark 15:8-15 NASU 8 "The crowd went up and began asking him to do as he had been accustomed to do for them. 9 Pilate answered them, saying, "Do you want me to release for you the King of the Jews?" 10 For he was aware that the chief priests had handed Him over because of envy. 11 But the chief priests stirred up the crowdto ask him to release Barabbas for them instead. 12 Answering again, Pilate said to them, "Then what shall I do with Him whom you call the King of the Jews?" 13 They shouted back, "Crucify Him!" 14 But Pilate said to them, "Why, what evil has He done?" But they shouted all the more, "Crucify Him!"
- 3. Luke 23:18-24 NASU 18 "But they cried out all together, saying,"

 Away with this man, and release for us Barabbas!" 19 (He was one who had been thrown into prison for an insurrection made in the city, and for murder.) 20 Pilate, wanting to release Jesus, addressed them again, 21 but they kept on calling out, saying, "Crucify, crucify Him!"

 22 And he said to them the third time, "Why, what evil has this man done? I have found in Him no guilt demanding death; therefore I will punish Him and release Him." 23 But they were insistent, with loud voices asking that He be crucified. And their voices began to prevail."
- 4. John 19:14-15 NASU 14 "Now it was the day of preparation for the Passover; it was about the sixth hour. And he said to the Jews, "Behold, your King!" 15 So they cried out, " Away with Him, away with Him, crucify Him!" Pilate said to them, "Shall I crucify your King?" The chief priests answered, "We have no king but Caesar."

16. Messiah will enter Jerusalem riding on a donkey:

i. Zech 9:9 – NASU - 9 Rejoice greatly, O daughter of Zion! Shout in triumph, O daughter of Jerusalem! Behold, your king is coming to you; He is just and endowed with salvation, Humble, and mounted on a donkey, Even on a colt, the foal of a donkey."

ii. Revealed Covenant Fulfillment:

 Matt 21:1-11 – NASU - When they had approached Jerusalem and had come to Bethphage, at the Mount of Olives, then Jesus sent two disciples, 2 saying to them, "Go into the village opposite you, and immediately you will find a donkey tied there and a colt with her;

untie them and bring them to Me. 3 "If anyone says anything to you, you shall say, 'The Lord has need of them,' and immediately he will send them." 4 This took place to fulfill what was spoken through the prophet: 5 "SAY TO THE DAUGHTER OF ZION, 'BEHOLD YOUR KING IS COMING TO YOU, GENTLE, AND MOUNTED ON A DONKEY, EVEN ON A COLT, THE FOAL OF A BEAST OF BURDEN." 6 The disciples went and did just as Jesus had instructed them, 7 and brought the donkey and the colt, and laid their coats on them; and He sat on the coats. 8 Most of the crowd spread their coats in the road, and others were cutting branches from the trees and spreading them in the road. 9 The crowds going ahead of Him, and those who followed, were shouting, "Hosanna to the Son of David; BLESSED IS HE WHO COMES IN THE NAME OF THE LORD; Hosanna in the highest!" 10 When He had entered Jerusalem, all the city was stirred, saying, "Who is this?" 11 And the crowds were saying, "This is the prophet Jesus, from Nazareth in Galilee."

17. Messiah will enter the Temple with Authority:

i. Mal 3:1 – NASU - "Behold, I am going to send My messenger, and he will clear the way before Me. And the Lord, whom you seek, will suddenly come to His temple; and the messenger of the covenant, in whom you delight, behold, He is coming," says the Lord of hosts."

ii. Revealed Covenant Fulfillment:

- Matt 21:12-13 NASU 12 "And Jesus entered the temple and drove out all those who were buying and selling in the temple, and overturned the tables of the money changers and the seats of those who were selling doves. 13 And He said to them, "It is written, 'MY HOUSE SHALL BE CALLED A HOUSE OF PRAYER'; but you are making it a ROBBERS'DEN."
- Luke 19:45-46 NASU 45 "Jesus entered the temple and began to drive out those who were selling, 46 saying to them, "It is written, 'AND MY HOUSE SHALL BE A HOUSE OF PRAYER,' but you have made it a ROBBERS'DEN."

18. Messiah will betrayed (sold) for 30 pieces of Silver:

i. Zech 11:12-14 – NASU - 12 "I said to them, "If it is good in your sight, give me my wages; but if not, never mind!" So they weighed out thirty shekels of silver as my wages. 13 Then the Lord said to me, "Throw it to the potter, that magnificent price at which I was valued by them." So I took the thirty shekels of silver and threw them to the potter in the house of the Lord."

ii. Revealed Covenant Fulfillment:

Matt 26:14-16 – NASU - 14 "Then one of the twelve, named Judas
 Iscariot, went to the chief priests 15 and said, "What are you willing to give me to betray Him to you?" And they weighed out thirty pieces of

- silver to him. 16 From then on he began looking for a good opportunity to betray Jesus."
- 2. Matt 27:3-10 NASU 3 "Then when Judas, who had betrayed Him, saw that He had been condemned, he felt remorse and returned the thirty pieces of silver to the chief priests and elders, 4 saying, "I have sinned by betraying innocent blood." But they said, "What is that to us? See to that yourself!" 5 And he threw the pieces of silver into the temple sanctuary and departed; and he went away and hanged himself. 6 The chief priests took the pieces of silver and said, "It is not lawful to put them into the temple treasury, since it is the price of blood." 7 And they conferred together and with the money bought the Potter's Field as a burial place for strangers. 8 For this reason that field has been called the Field of Blood to this day. 9 Then that which was spoken through Jeremiah the prophet was fulfilled: "AND THEY TOOK THE THIRTY PIECES OF SILVER, THE PRICE OF THE ONE WHOSE PRICE HAD BEEN SET by the sons of Israel; 10 AND THEY GAVE THEM FOR THE POTTER'S FIELD, AS THE LORD DIRECTED ME."

19. Messiah will be forsaken by His Disciples:

i. Zech 13:7 – NASU - 7 "Awake, O sword, against My Shepherd, And against the man, My Associate," Declares the Lord of hosts. " Strike the Shepherd that the sheep may be scattered; And I will turn My hand against the little ones. "

ii. Revealed Covenant Fulfillment:

- Matt 26:31-32- NASU 31 Then Jesus said to them, "You will all fall away because of Me this night, for it is written, 'I WILL STRIKE DOWN THE SHEPHERD, AND THE SHEEP OF THE FLOCK SHALL BE SCATTERED."
- 2. Matt 26:55-56 NASU 55 "At that time Jesus said to the crowds, "Have you come out with swords and clubs to arrest Me as you would against a robber? Every day I used to sit in the temple teaching and you did not seize Me. 56 "But all this has taken place to fulfill the Scriptures of the prophets." Then all the disciples left Him and fled."

20. Messiah will be accused by false witnesses:

 Ps 35:11-12 – NASU - 11 "Malicious witnesses rise up; They ask me of things that I do not know. 12 They repay me evil for good, To the bereavement of my soul."

ii. Revealed Covenant Fulfillment:

Matt 26:59-61 – NASU - 59 Now the chief priests and the whole
 Council kept trying to obtain false testimony against Jesus, so that
 they might put Him to death. 60 They did not find any, even though
 many false witnesses came forward. But later on two came forward,
 61 and said, "This man stated, 'I am able to destroy the temple of God and to rebuild it in three days."

Mark 14:56-59 – NASU - 56 For many were giving false testimony
against Him, but their testimony was not consistent. 57 Some stood up
and began to give false testimony against Him, saying, 58 "We heard
Him say, ' I will destroy this temple made with hands, and in three
days I will build another made without hands."

21. Messiah will be hated without a cause:

- Ps 35:19-21 NASU 19 Do not let those who are wrongfully my enemies
 rejoice over me; Nor let those who hate me without cause wink maliciously.
 20 For they do not speak peace, But they devise deceitful words against those
 who are quiet in the land. 21 They opened their mouth wide against me; They
 said, "Aha, aha, our eyes have seen it!"
- ii. Ps 69:4 NASU 4 Those who hate me without a cause are more than the hairs of my head; Those who would destroy me are powerful, being wrongfully my enemies; What I did not steal, I then have to restore.

iii. Revealed Covenant Fulfillment:

 John 15:23-25 – NASU - 23 "He who hates Me hates My Father also. 24 " If I had not done among them the works which no one else did, they would not have sin; but now they have both seen and hated Me and My Father as well. 25 "But they have done this to fulfill the word that is written in their Law, 'THEY HATED ME WITHOUT A CAUSE.'"

22. Messiah will be betrayed by one of His followers (a friend):

i. Ps 41:9 – NASU - 9 Even my close friend in whom I trusted, Who ate my bread,
 Has lifted up his heel against me."

ii. Revealed Covenant Fulfillment:

John 13:18-20 – NASU - 18 " I do not speak of all of you. I know the ones I have chosen; but it is that the Scripture may be fulfilled, 'HE WHO EATS MY BREAD HAS LIFTED UP HIS HEEL AGAINST ME.' 19 "From now on I am telling you before it comes to pass, so that when it does occur, you may believe that I am He. 20 "Truly, truly, I say to you, he who receives whomever I send receives Me; and he who receives Me receives Him who sent Me."

23. Messiah will be silent before his accusers:

Isa 53:7 – NASU - 7 "He was oppressed and He was afflicted, Yet He did not open His mouth; Like a lamb that is led to slaughter, And like a sheep that is silent before its shearers, So He did not open His mouth."

ii. Revealed Covenant Fulfillment:

- Matt 26:62-63 NASU 62 "The high priest stood up and said to Him,
 "Do You not answer? What is it that these men are testifying against
 You?" 63 But Jesus kept silent."
- Matt 27:12-14 NASU 12 "And while He was being accused by the chief priests and elders, He did not answer. 13 Then Pilate said to Him, "Do You not hear how many things they testify against You?" 14 And

He did not answer him with regard to even a single charge, so the governor was quite amazed."

24. Messiah will be beaten, mocked, spat upon:

 Isa 50:6 – NASU - 6 "I gave My back to those who strike Me, And My cheeks to those who pluck out the beard; I did not cover My face from humiliation and spitting."

ii. Revealed Covenant Fulfillment:

- Matt 26:67-68 NASU 67 "Then they spat in His face and beat Him with their fists; and others slapped Him, 68 and said, " Prophesy to us, You Christ; who is the one who hit You?"
- 2. Matt 27:26-31 NASU 26 "Then he released Barabbas for them; but after having Jesus scourged, he handed Him over to be crucified. 27 Then the soldiers of the governor took Jesus into the Praetorium and gathered the whole Roman cohort around Him. 28 They stripped Him and put a scarlet robe on Him. 29 And after twisting together a crown of thorns, they put it on His head, and a reed in His right hand; and they knelt down before Him and mocked Him, saying, " Hail, King of the Jews!" 30 They spat on Him, and took the reed and began to beat Him on the head. 31 After they had mocked Him, they took the scarlet robe off Him and put His own garments back on Him, and led Him away to crucify Him."

25. Messiah will be crucified with criminals:

i. <u>Isa 53:12 – NASU - 12 "Therefore, I will allot Him a portion with the great, And He will divide the booty with the strong; Because He poured out Himself to death, And was numbered with the transgressors; Yet He Himself bore the sin of many, And interceded for the transgressors."</u>

ii. Revealed Covenant Fulfillment:

- Matt 27:38-39 NASU 38 "At that time two robbers were crucified with Him, one on the right and one on the left."
- Mark 15:27-29 NASU 27 "They crucified two robbers with Him, one on His right and one on His left. 28 [And the Scripture was fulfilled which says, "And He was numbered with transgressors."]"
- 3. <u>Luke 23:32-33 NASU 32</u> "Two others also, who were criminals, were being led away to be put to death with Him. 33 When they came to the place called The Skull, there they crucified Him and the criminals, one on the right and the other on the left."

26. Messiah will suffer for the sins of mankind:

- i. The majority of the Book of Psalm 22 should be read to grasp the full nature of Jesus (Yeshua's) suffering for mankind.
- ii. Messiah will be mocked:
 - 1. Ps 22:6-8 NASU 6 But I am a worm and not a man,

 A reproach of men and despised by the people. 7 All who see me sneer at me; They separate with the lip, they wag the head, saying, 8 "
 Commit yourself to the Lord; let Him deliver him; Let Him rescue him, because He delights in him."

3. Revealed Covenant Fulfillment:

- Luke 23:11 NASU 11 "And Herod with his soldiers, after treating Him with contempt and mocking Him, dressed Him in a gorgeous robe and sent Him back to Pilate."
- ii. <u>Luke 23:11 NASU 11 And Herod with his soldiers, after</u>

 <u>treating Him with contempt and mocking Him, dressed Him in</u>
 a gorgeous robe and sent Him back to Pilate."

i. Messiah will be pierced through his hands and feet:

1. Ps 22:16 - NASU - 16 For dogs have surrounded me; A band of evildoers has encompassed me; They pierced my hands and my feet."

2. Revealed Covenant Fulfillment:

- Luke 23:33-34 NASU 33 When they came to the place called The Skull, there they crucified Him and the criminals, one on the right and the other on the left. "
- things, He Himself stood in their midst and said to them,
 "Peace be to you." 37 But they were startled and frightened
 and thought that they were seeing a spirit. 38 And He said to
 them, "Why are you troubled, and why do doubts arise in your
 hearts? 39 " See My hands and My feet, that it is I Myself;
 touch Me and see, for a spirit does not have flesh and bones as
 you see that I have."
- iii. John 19:18-20 NASU 18 There they crucified Him, and with Him two other men, one on either side, and Jesus in between. 19 Pilate also wrote an inscription and put it on the cross. It was written, "JESUS THE NAZARENE, THE KING OF THE JEWS."
- iv. John 20:24-27 NASU 24 But Thomas, one of the twelve, called Didymus, was not with them when Jesus came. 25 So the other disciples were saying to him, "We have seen the Lord!" But he said to them, "Unless I see in His hands the imprint of the nails, and put my finger into the place of the nails, and put my hand into His side, I will not believe." 26 After eight days His disciples were again inside, and Thomas with them. Jesus came, the doors having been shut, and stood in their midst and said, "Peace be with you." 27 Then He said to Thomas, "Reach here with your finger, and see My hands; and reach here your hand and put it into My side; and do not be unbelieving, but believing."

ii. Messiah's bones will not be broken (as is commonly done during crucifixion to hasten death):

- Ps 22:17 NASU 17 I can count all my bones. They look, they stare at me;"
- 2. Ps 34:20 NASU 20 He keeps all his bones, Not one of them is broken."

3. Revealed Covenant Fulfillment:

- i. John 19:31-34 NASU 31 Then the Jews, because it was the day of preparation, so that the bodies would not remain on the cross on the Sabbath (for that Sabbath was a high day), asked Pilate that their legs might be broken, and that they might be taken away. 32 So the soldiers came, and broke the legs of the first man and of the other who was crucified with Him; 33 but coming to Jesus, when they saw that He was already dead, they did not break His legs."
- ii. John 19:36-37 NASU 36 For these things came to pass to fulfill the Scripture, "NOT A BONE OF HIM SHALL BE BROKEN."

iii. Men will gamble for Messiah's garments:

- Ps 22:18 NASU 18 They divide my garments among them,
 And for my clothing they cast lots. "
- 2. Revealed Covenant Fulfillment:
 - Matt 27:35-36 NASU 35 And when they had crucified Him, they divided up His garments among themselves by casting lots."
 - ii. Mark 15:24 NASU 24 And they crucified Him, and divided up His garments among themselves, casting lots for them to decide what each man should take."
 - iii. Luke 23:34-35 NASU 34 But Jesus was saying, "

 Father, forgive them; for they do not know what they are doing." And they cast lots, dividing up His arments among themselves."
 - iv. John 19:23-25 NASU 23 Then the soldiers, when they had crucified Jesus, took His outer garments and made four parts, a part to every soldier and also the tunic; now the tunic was seamless, woven in one piece. 24 So they said to one another, " Let us not tear it, but cast lots for it, to decide whose it shall be";this was to fulfill the Scripture: "THEY DIVIDED MY OUTER GARMENTS AMONG THEM, AND FOR MY CLOTHING THEY CAST LOTS."

27. Messiah will be given vinegar to drink:

i. Ps 69:21 – NASU - 21 "They also gave me gall for my food And for my thirst they gave me vinegar to drink."

ii. Revealed Covenant Fulfillment:

- Matt 27:33-34 NASU 33 "And when they came to a place called Golgotha, which means Place of a Skull, 34 they gave Him wine to drink mixed with gall; and after tasting it, He was unwilling to drink."
- Mark 15:22-23 NASU 22 "Then they brought Him to the place Golgotha, which is translated, Place of a Skull. 23 They tried to give Him wine mixed with myrrh; but He did not take it."
- 3. John 19:28-30 NASU 28 "After this, Jesus, knowing that all things had already been accomplished, to fulfill the Scripture, said, "I am thirsty." 29 A jar full of sour wine was standing there; so they put a sponge full of the sour wine upon a branch of hyssop and brought it up to His mouth. "

28. Messiah will be killed:

i. Isa 53:5-9 – NASU - 5 "But He was pierced through for our transgressions, He was crushed for our iniquities; The chastening for our well-being fell upon Him, And by His scourging we are healed. 6 All of us like sheep have gone astray, Each of us has turned to his own way; But the Lord has caused the iniquity of us all To fall on Him. 7 He was oppressed and He was afflicted, Yet He did not open His mouth; Like a lamb that is led to slaughter, And like a sheep that is silent before its shearers, So He did not open His mouth. 8 By oppression and judgment He was taken away; And as for His generation, who considered That He was cut off out of the land of the living For the transgression of my people, to whom the stroke was due? 9 His grave was assigned with wicked men, Yet He was with a rich man in His death, Because He had done no violence, Nor was there any deceit in His mouth."

ii. Revealed Covenant Fulfillment:

- 1. Matt 27:50-54 NASU 50 "And Jesus cried out again with a loud voice, and yielded up His spirit. 51 And behold, the veil of the temple was torn in two from top to bottom; and the earth shook and the rocks were split. 52 The tombs were opened, and many bodies of the saints who had fallen asleep were raised; 53 and coming out of the tombs after His resurrection they entered the holy city and appeared to many. 54 Now the centurion, and those who were with him keeping guard over Jesus, when they saw the earthquake and the things that were happening, became very frightened and said, "Truly this was the Son of God!"
- Mark 15:37-39 NASU 37 "And Jesus uttered a loud cry, and breathed His last. 38 And the veil of the temple was torn in two from top to bottom. 39 When the centurion, who was standing

- right in front of Him, saw the way He breathed His last, he said,
 "Truly this man was the Son of God!"
- Luke 23:46-48 NASU 46 "And Jesus, crying out with a loud voice, said, "Father,INTO YOUR HANDS I COMMIT MY SPIRIT."
 Having said this, He breathed His last. 47 Now when the centurion saw what had happened, he began praising God, saying,
 "Certainly this man was innocent."
- John 19:30 NASU 30 "Therefore when Jesus had received the sour wine, He said, " It is finished!" And He bowed His head and gave up His spirit."

29. Messiah will be buried among the rich:

i. <u>Isa 53:9 – NASU - 9 "His grave was assigned with wicked men, Yet He was with a rich man in His death, Because He had done no violence, Nor was there any deceit in His mouth."</u>

ii. Revealed Covenant Fulfillment:

- Matt 27:59-60 NASU 59 "And Joseph took the body and wrapped it in a clean linen cloth, 60 and laid it in his own new tomb, which he had hewn out in the rock; and he rolled a large stone against the entrance of the tomb and went away."
- Mark 15:46 NASU 46 "Joseph bought a linen cloth, took Him down, wrapped Him in the linen cloth and laid Him in a tomb which had been hewn out in the rock; and he rolled a stone against the entrance of the tomb."
- 3. Luke 23:50-53 NASU 50 "And a man named Joseph, who was a member of the Council, a good and righteous man 51 (he had not consented to their plan and action), a man from Arimathea, a city of the Jews, who was waiting for the kingdom of God; 52 this man went to Pilate and asked for the body of Jesus. 53 And he took it down and wrapped it in a linen cloth, and laid Him in a tomb cut into the rock, where no one had ever lain."
- 4. John 19:38-42 NASU 38 "After these things Joseph of Arimathea, being a disciple of Jesus, but a secret one for fear of the Jews, asked Pilate that he might take away the body of Jesus; and Pilate granted permission. So he came and took away His body. 39 Nicodemus, who had first come to Him by night, also came, bringing a mixture of myrrh and aloes, about a hundred pounds weight. 40 So they took the body of Jesus and bound it in linen wrappings with the spices, as is the burial custom of the Jews. 41 Now in the place where He was crucified there was a garden, and in the garden a new tomb in which no one had yet been laid. 42 Therefore because of the Jewish day of preparation, since the tomb was nearby, they laid Jesus there."

30. Messiah will be raised from the dead:

i. Ps 16:10-11- NASU – "For You will not abandon my soul to Sheol; Nor will You allow Your Holy One to undergo decay. 11 You will make known to me the path of life; In Your presence is fullness of joy; In Your right hand there are pleasures forever."

ii. Revealed Covenant Fulfillment:

- 1. John 20:11-20 NASU But Mary was standing outside the tomb weeping; and so, as she wept, she stooped and looked into the tomb; 12 and she saw two angels in white sitting, one at the head and one at the feet, where the body of Jesus had been lying. 13 And they said to her, " Woman, why are you weeping?" She said to them, "Because they have taken away my Lord, and I do not know where they have laid Him." 14 When she had said this, she turned around and saw Jesus standing there, and did not know that it was Jesus. 15 Jesus said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping? Whom are you seeking?" Supposing Him to be the gardener, she said to Him, "Sir, if you have carried Him away, tell me where you have laid Him, and I will take Him away." 16 Jesus said to her, "Mary!" She turned and said to Him in Hebrew, " Rabboni!" (which means, Teacher). 17 Jesus said to her, "Stop clinging to Me, for I have not yet ascended to the Father; but go to My brethren and say to them, 'I ascend to My Father and your Father, and My God and your God." 18 Mary Magdalene came, announcing to the disciples, "I have seen the Lord," and that He had said these things to her. 19 So when it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and when the doors were shut where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." 20 And when He had said this, He showed them both His hands and His side. The disciples then rejoiced when they saw the Lord."
- Acts 1:3-4 NASU To these He also presented Himself alive after
 His suffering, by many convincing proofs, appearing to them over a
 period of forty days and speaking of the things concerning the
 kingdom of God."
- 3. Acts 2:32-33 NASU 2 "This Jesus God raised up again, to which we are all witnesses."

31. Messiah will ascend to the right-hand of God:

- Ps 68:18 NASU 18 You have ascended on high, You have led captive Your captives; You have received gifts among men, Even among the rebellious also, that the Lord God may dwell there."
- ii. Revealed Covenant Fulfillment

- 1. <u>Luke 24:51-52 NASU 51 "While He was blessing them, He</u> parted from them and was carried up into heaven."
- Acts 1:9 NASU 9 "And after He had said these things, He was lifted up while they were looking on, and a cloud received Him out of their sight."
- Acts 2:33-35 NASU 33 "Therefore having been exalted to the right hand of God, and having received from the Father the promise of the Holy Spirit, He has poured forth this which you both see and hear. 34 "For it was not David who ascended into heaven, but he himself says: 'THE LORD SAID TO MY LORD, "SIT AT MY RIGHT HAND, 35 UNTIL I MAKE YOUR ENEMIES A FOOTSTOOL FOR YOUR FEET."'
- Acts 3:20-21 NASU 20 and that He may send Jesus, the Christ appointed for you, 21 whom heaven must receive until the period of restoration of all things about which God spoke by the mouth of His holy prophets from ancient time.
- 5. Acts 5:31-32 NASU 31 " He is the one whom God exalted to His right hand as a Prince and a Savior, to grant repentance to Israel, and forgiveness of sins. 32 "And we are witnesses of these things; andso is the Holy Spirit, whom God has given to those who obey Him."
- 6. Acts 7:55-57 NASU 55 But being full of the Holy Spirit, he gazed intently into heaven and saw the glory of God, and Jesus standing at the right hand of God; 56 and he said, "Behold, I see the heavens opened up and the Son of Man standing at the right hand of God."
- 7. Rom 8:34-35 NASU 34 who is the one who condemns? Christ Jesus is He who died, yes, rather who was raised, who is at the right hand of God, who also intercedes for us.
- 8. Eph 1:20-22 NASU 20 which He brought about in Christ, when He raised Him from the dead and seated Him at His right hand in the heavenly places, 21 far above all rule and authority and power and dominion, and every name that is named, not only in this age but also in the one to come.
- Col 3:1 NASU "Therefore if you have been raised up with Christ, keep seeking the things above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God."
- 10. Heb 1:3-4 NASU 3 " And He is the radiance of His glory and the exact representation of His nature, and upholds all things by the word of His power. When He had made purification of sins, He sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high, 4 having become as

- much better than the angels, as He has inherited a more excellent name than they."
- 11. Heb 8:1-3 NASU "Now the main point in what has been said is this: we have such a high priest, who has taken His seat at the right hand of the throne of the Majesty in the heavens, 2 a minister in the sanctuary and in the true tabernacle, which the Lord pitched, not man."

Heb 10:11-17 NASU 11 Every priest stands daily ministering and offering time after time the same sacrifices, which can never take away sins; 12 but He, having offered one sacrifice for sins for all time, SAT DOWN AT THE RIGHT HAND OF GOD, 13 waiting from that time onwardUNTIL HIS ENEMIES BE MADE A FOOTSTOOL FOR HIS FEET. 14 For by one offering He has perfected for all time those who are sanctified. 15 And the Holy Spirit also testifies to us; for after saying, 16 "THIS IS THE COVENANT THAT I WILL MAKE WITH THEM AFTER THOSE DAYS, SAYS THE LORD: I WILL PUT MY LAWS UPON THEIR HEART, AND ON THEIR MIND I WILL WRITE THEM," "He then says, 17 "AND THEIR SINS AND THEIR LAWLESS DEEDS I WILL REMEMBER NO MORE."
- 13. Heb 12:1-2 NASU "Therefore, since we have so great a cloud of witnesses surrounding us, let us also lay aside every encumbrance and the sin which so easily entangles us, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, 2 fixing our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of faith, who for the joy set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God."
- 14. 1 Peter 3:21-22 NASU 21 "Corresponding to that, baptism now saves you not the removal of dirt from the flesh, but an appeal to God for a good conscience through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, 22 who is at the right hand of God, having gone into heaven, after angels and authorities and powers had been subjected to Him."

32. Messiah will be our continual Intercessor before God:

i. Isa 59:16-20 – NASU - 6 "And He saw that there was no man, And was astonished that there was no one to intercede; Then His own arm brought salvation to Him, And His righteousness upheld Him. 17 He put on righteousness like a breastplate, And a helmet of salvation on His head; And He put on garments of vengeance for clothing And wrapped Himself with zeal as a mantle. 18 According to their deeds, so He will repay, Wrath to His adversaries, recompense to His enemies; To the coastlands He will make recompense. 19 So they will fear the name of the Lord from the west And His glory from the rising of the sun, For He will come like a rushing stream Which

the wind of the Lord drives. 20 "A Redeemer will come to Zion, And to those who turn from transgression in Jacob," declares the Lord."

- ii. Revealed Covenant Fulfillment:
 - Heb 9:15-16 NASU 15 "For this reason He is the mediator of a new covenant, so that, since a death has taken place for the redemption of the transgressions that were committed under the first covenant, those who have been called may receive the promise of the eternal inheritance."
 - a. { Again, please remember the writer of Hebrews wrote to believing Hebrews (of that day), but with a Greek mindset and Greek phraseology. Therefore, again, the use of the word "NEW" (v. 15) is better understood as God declaring Yeshua / Jesus as Intercessor of the "RE-NEWED" or "FULLY REVEALED" Covenant. }

33. Messiah is part of an EVERLASTING COVENANT:

- i. <u>Isa 55:3-4 NASU "Incline your ear and come to Me. Listen, that you may live; And I will make an everlasting covenant with you, According to the faithful mercies shown to David. 4 "Behold, I have made him a witness to the peoples, A leader and commander for the peoples."</u>
- ii. Jer 31:31-34 NASU 31 " Behold, days are coming," declares the Lord, "when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and with the house of Judah, 32 not like the covenant which I made with their fathers in the day I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt, My covenant which they broke, although I was a husband to them," declares the Lord. 33 "But this is the covenant which I will make with the house of Israel after those days," declares the Lord, " I will put My law within them and on their heart I will write it; and I will be their God, and they shall be My people. 34 "They will not teach again, each man his neighbor and each man his brother, saying, 'Know the Lord,' for they will all know Me, from the least of them to the greatest of them," declares the Lord, "for I will forgive their iniquity, and their sin I will remember no more."
- iv. { Note The use of the word "new" (v. 31) is more accurately translated (from the original Hebrew) as "Re-newed" (as in something re-instated or restored).
 - 3. H2319 = chadash (khaw-dawsh') fresh, new thing
 - 4. From the root word H2318 = chadash (khaw-dash')
 - v. A primitive root;
 - vi. To cause to be new;
 - vii. Causatively, to REBUILD;
 - viii. **RENEW or REPAIR !!!!!** }
 - iii. Revealed Covenant Fulfillment:
 - Matt 26:26-29 NASU 26 "While they were eating, Jesus took some bread, and after a blessing, He broke it and gave it to the

- disciples, and said, "Take, eat; this is My body." 27 And when He had taken a cup and given thanks, He gave it to them, saying, "Drink from it, all of you; 28 for this is My blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many for forgiveness of sins. 29 "But I say to you, I will not drink of this fruit of the vine from now on until that day when I drink it new with you in My Father's kingdom."
- 2. Mark 14:22-25 NASU 22 "While they were eating, He took some bread, and after a blessing He broke it, and gave it to them, and said, "Take it; this is My body." 23 And when He had taken a cup and given thanks, He gave it to them, and they all drank from it. 24 And He said to them, "This is My blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many. 25 "Truly I say to you, I will never again drink of the fruit of the vine until that day when I drink it new in the kingdom of God."
- 3. Luke 22:14-21 NASU 14 "When the hour had come, He reclined at the table, and the apostles with Him. 15 And He said to them, "I have earnestly desired to eat this Passover with you before I suffer; 16 for I say to you, I shall never again eat it until it is fulfilled in the kingdom of God." 17 And when He had taken a cup and given thanks, He said, "Take this and share it among yourselves; 18 for I say to you, I will not drink of the fruit of the vine from now on until the kingdom of God comes." 19 And when He had taken some bread and given thanks, He broke it and gave it to them, saying, "This is My body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of Me." 20 And in the same way He took the cup after they had eaten, saying, "This cup which is poured out for you is the new covenant in My blood."
- 4. { Again, use of the word "new" (in v. 20) was a word used by Jesus / Yeshua, and more than likely in Aramaic, then translated by Luke into Greek. Since Yeshua did nothing to cancel nor augment the existing Scriptures, it is most likely he was meaning "RE-NEWED or REVEALED" as explained above. }
 - ix. Remember, Yeshua said: Matt 5:17-19 NASU 17 "Do not think that I came to abolish the Law or the Prophets; I did not come to abolish but to fulfill. 18 "For truly I say to you, until heaven and earth pass away, not the smallest letter or stroke shall pass from the Law until all is accomplished."
- Heb 8:6-11 NASU 6 "But now He has obtained a more excellent ministry, by as much as He is also the mediator of a better covenant, which has been enacted on better promises. 7 For if that first covenant had been faultless, there would have been no

occasion sought for a second. 8 For finding fault with them, He says, "BEHOLD, DAYS ARE COMING, SAYS THE LORD, WHEN I WILL EFFECT A NEW (read as "RENEWED or REVEALED") COVENANT WITH THE HOUSE OF ISRAEL AND WITH THE HOUSE OF JUDAH; 9 NOT LIKE THE COVENANT WHICH I MADE WITH THEIR FATHERS ON THE DAY WHEN I TOOK THEM BY THE HAND TO LEAD THEM OUT OF THE LAND OF EGYPT; FOR THEY DID NOT CONTINUE IN MY COVENANT, AND I DID NOT CARE FOR THEM, SAYS THE LORD. 10 "FOR THIS IS THE COVENANT THAT I WILL MAKE WITH THE HOUSE OF ISRAEL AFTER THOSE DAYS, SAYS THE LORD: I WILL PUT MY LAWS INTO THEIR MINDS, AND I WILL WRITE THEM ON THEIR HEARTS. AND I WILL BE THEIR GOD, AND THEY SHALL BE MY PEOPLE. 11 "AND THEY SHALL NOT TEACH EVERYONE HIS FELLOW CITIZEN,"

i. { Remember, the writer of Hebrews quotes from the Septuagint (a Greek Translation of the Original Covenant – OT), and therefore uses the Greek mindset of OLD versus NEW. }

34. Messiah will return to earth at a prescribed time:

i. Dan 9:25-26 – NASU - 25 "So you are to know and discern that from the issuing of a decree to restore and rebuild Jerusalem until Messiah the Prince there will be seven weeks and sixty-two weeks; it will be built again, with plaza and moat, even in times of distress. 26 "Then after the sixty-two weeks the Messiah will be cut off and have nothing, and the people of the prince who is to come will destroy the city and the sanctuary."

ii. Revealed Covenant Fulfillment:

- Gal 4:4-6 NASU 4 But when the fullness of the time came, God sent forth His Son, born of a woman, born under the Law, 5 so that He might redeem those who were under the Law, that we might receive the adoption as sons."
- Eph 1:9-10 NASU 9 He made known to us the mystery of His will, according to His kind intention which He purposed in Him 10 with a view to an administration suitable to the fullness of the times, that is, the summing up of all things in Christ, things in the heavens and things on the earth."

Although we have examined several of the prominent Prophecies regarding the Messiah, I wish to state my view that no amount of study could ever fully uncover all the prophetic details and their fulfillment. Indeed, it is the author's opinion that the entire Bible (Tanakh and Revealed Covenant combined) is

entirely about the Person / Identity and Work of Messiah Yeshua, and I look forward to spending all eternity learning ever-new prophetic aspects of Yeshua contained therein.
